He has provided advice to dairy farmers, government extension services and milk processors in Australia, Azerbaijan, P.R. China, Indonesia, Iran, Rwanda and Mongolia.

He has been team leader and development economist on more than 40 assignments for AusAID, the Australian development agency, the World Bank, the Asian Development Bank, the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD), the UN Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO) and the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA). These assignments included the design and evaluation of rural and community development projects and programs with budgets up to US\$100 million. He has worked in P.R. China for more than 48 months and undertaken more than 25 assignments over 24 months across most parts of Indonesia.

In 2012 he was dairy value chain specialist for preparing a national dairy industry strategy for Rwanda. In 1996 he led a 8 person team preparing a national dairy industry strategy for Iran. In 2012 he was lead reviewer for appraisal of a proposal for 12,000 cow dairy feedlot and milk processing plant in NSW.
